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Dear California Winegrower:

In early 2010, the Oregon Department of Agriculture (ODA) updated its grape quarantine rule to minimize the risk of dangerous invasive species coming into Oregon.

Therefore, growers importing fruits into Oregon must adhere to the following restrictions:

1. All parts of *Vitis* sp., including fruits, must be free of harmful pests and diseases including *but not limited to*: grape vine leaf roll-associated viruses, grape phylloxera, vine mealybug and the European grapevine moth.
2. All shipments must be accompanied by a phytosanitary certificate or certificate of quarantine compliance issued by a county, state or federal official, certifying that the plant material or fruits are free of harmful pests and diseases. The phytosanitary certificate must state that:

“The fruit has been inspected and to the best of the knowledge of the inspecting official are free from harmful pests and diseases. “


All treatments must be described on the certificate and other States quarantines may apply such as for the glassywinged sharpshooter, European brown garden snail, or Japanese beetle depending on the origin.
