Happy new year to all and welcome back.

Here are a few quick announcements as you resume whatever you set aside over the holidays.

First, in response to your input that prices for Oregon Wine Symposium tickets may have kept some of you away from our industry's most popular event in years past, make that resolution now to take advantage of the **deepest ticket discounts that expire in just 12 days**. <u>Click here</u> to register for the Symposium, Feb. 21 - 22 in Portland!

Second, we are just a few days away from the deadline for submitting applications to be included in the Symposium's experimental wine tasting. We listened to your feedback from last year and have implemented some logistical changes to make the experience better for everyone. Each trial will be limited to two comparisons and presenters will each be asked to preview their trial in five minute flash talks for Symposium attendees immediately preceding the presentation of wines on the trade show floor. Each trial tasting booth will have a digital monitor to display the most important information on the wines. If you are

Third, for wineries using recently EPA-registered sulfur dioxide gas purchased from Airgas on wine barrels or corks, you will want to make sure you or your employees enroll in one of Oregon OSHA's respiratory protection classes, presented in conjunction with ODA and offered through Chemeketa Community College. Airgas has registered its SO2 as a restricted-use pesticide in Oregon since disinfectants are categorized as pesticides. The next four-hour classes on using it safely are set for Feb. 9 at Chemeketa Community College's NW Wine Studies Center in Salem and Apr. 6 at the McMinnville campus. You only need to attend one and each begins at 8:30 a.m. The cost to attend is \$45. Four pesticide recertification credit hours are offered. For more information, contact <u>Garnet Cooke</u>, pesticide coordinator at OSHA. We will be sure to let you know as additional OSHA/ODA class dates at other Oregon locations are announced.

OLCC Warns Liquor Licensees of Scam Callers

The Oregon Liquor Control Commission warns liquor licensed businesses of scam phone calls from people misrepresenting themselves as members of state or federal law enforcement. The fake callers claim to be a "Special Agent" and that the licensee has outstanding fees and/or citations. The scam callers demand that the liquor licensee come down to the courthouse to meet with them or else warrants will be issued. OLCC urges any business receiving these false phone calls to notify both local police and the local OLCC office. Contact information for OLCC offices can be found on the <u>agency website</u>.

Revised Worker Protection Standard Rules Took Effect Jan. 2

The <u>Worker Protection Standard</u> (WPS), administered by the Environmental Protection Agency, was revised in 2015 to enhance the protections for farm workers and pesticide applicators from the risks of pesticides. The changes went into effect on Jan. 2 and apply to all farms, including vineyards. The WPS now requires yearly training of agricultural workers, mandatory record keeping for pesticide use and enhanced posting requirements. <u>Click here</u> for more information and various resources complied by Dr. Patty Skinkis, viticulture extension specialist and associate professor at Oregon State University.
