NWS Portland Frost/Freeze Program Status Update

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Date: Jan. 10, 2023**





NWS Portland Frost/Freeze Program

(for northwest Oregon and southwest Washington)



- Frost Advisories will be issued for widespread temperatures around 33 to 36 degrees.
- Freeze Warnings will be issued for widespread temperatures around 29 to 32 degrees.
- Freeze Watches will be issued around 2 to 3 days in advance of a potential freeze event to alert people who may need more time to prepare.
- Hard Freeze Warnings will be issued for widespread temperatures around 28 degrees or colder.
- Hard Freeze Watches will be issued around 2 to 3 days in advance of a potential hard freeze event to alert people who may need more time to prepare.
- The headlines described above will only be issued if the frost and/or freeze event occurs between April 1st and October 31st. These headlines will not be issued for the high Cascades.





Hot Summer into early Autumn 2022




High pressure maintained unusually dry and warm conditions across the region. For many sites, each month was in the top 10 warmest for that month (see table below). Interestingly, it was overnight lows that contributed most to boosting these warm months.






