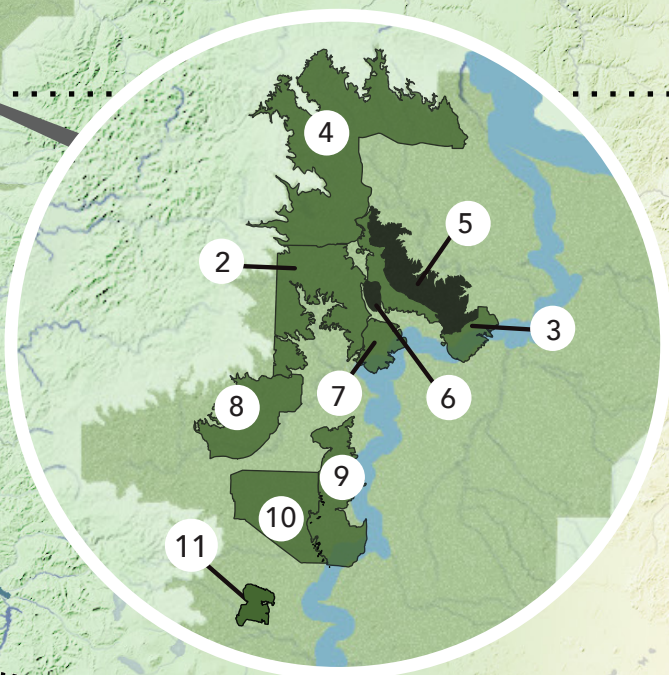
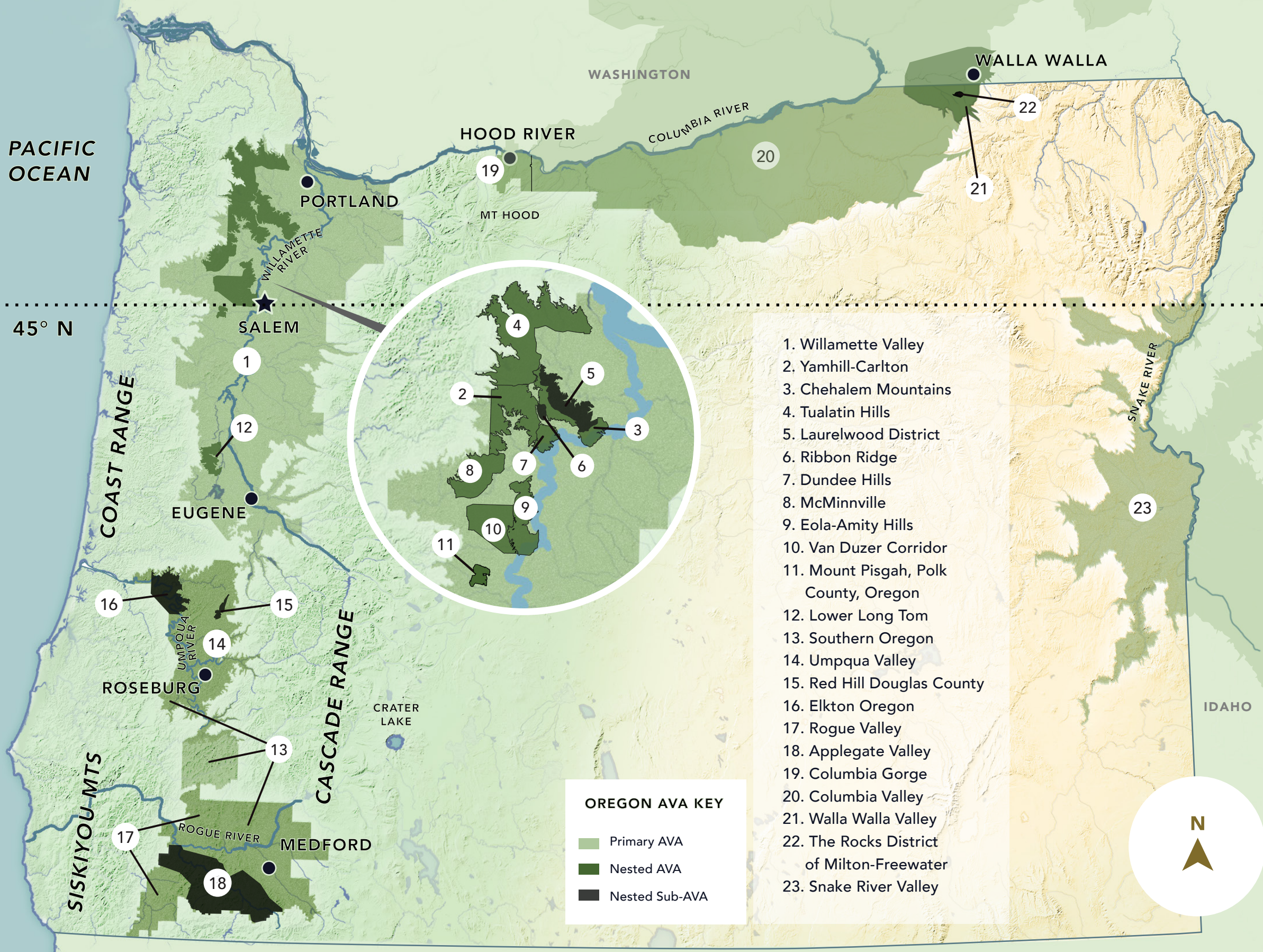

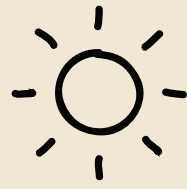

Little to no rainfall in the summer

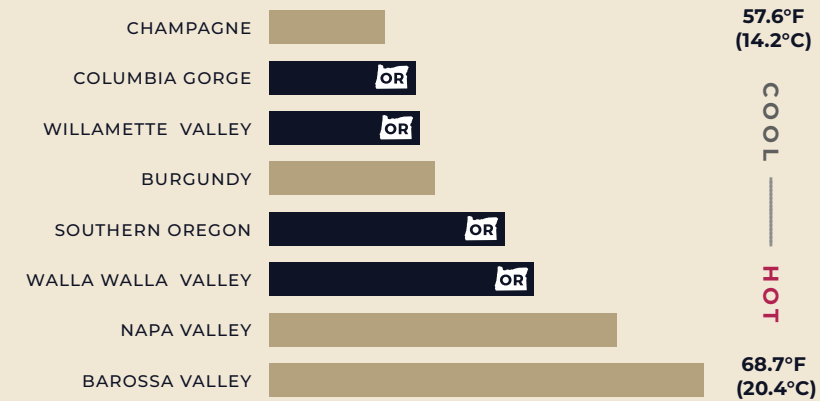


Short growing season due to northerly latitude and Pacific Ocean influence



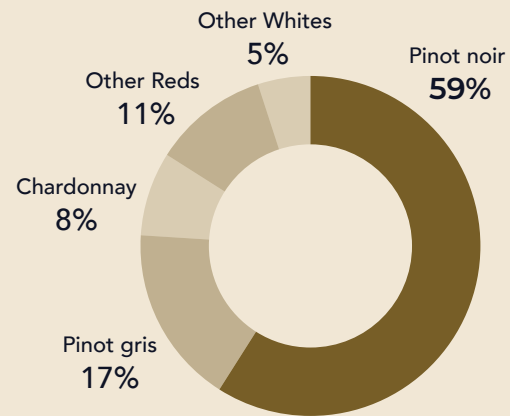
Higher acid, balanced flavor development leads to quality, food-friendly wines

AVERAGE GROWING SEASON TEMPERATURE °F (°C)

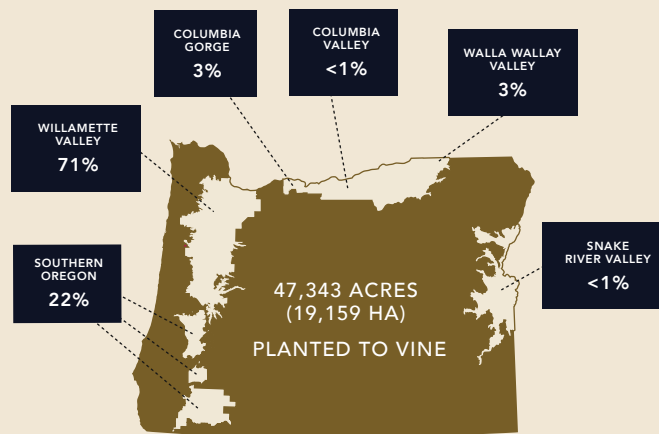


Vineyards

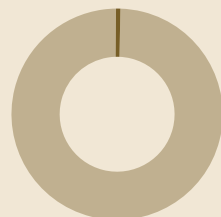

Oregon's predominant grape growing soils are the result of millions of years of geological history.

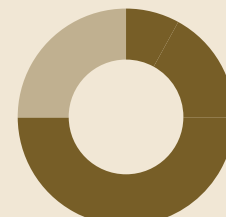
